# IT IS THE APPLICANTS RESPONSIBILITY TO:

- \* **RESEARCH** thoroughly all the courses for which he/she is making application. This means find out about the course content/modules for each year of the course. Is work experience part of the course?
- Do not look at 1<sup>st</sup> Yr. only, look at content for all years of the course.
- Some colleges give a detailed outline of each module eg NUIM (course finder), NUIG (course outline)

- **x** Go to Open Days
- Be au fait with all aspects of the application system used (CAO) for these courses, i.e., procedures, dates, fees, rules, etc.



## CAO PROCESS

- Centralised application system for all Irish 3<sup>rd</sup> level institutions, including fee-paying colleges.
- Every 6<sup>th</sup> year should now have a CAO Application Pack which includes: 2020 CAO Handbook – application and course information
- x Application Dates and Fees
- x CAO on line application \*NOW OPEN\*

All fees are non-refundable.	FEE	CLOSING DATE

# National Framework of Qualifications



## **QUALIFICATION LEVELS**

- Level 9 / 10 Masters/ PhD
- Level 8 Honours Degree
- Level 7 Ordinary Degree
- Level 6 Higher Certificate
- Level 4/5 Leaving Certificate/PLC
- Level 3 Junior Certificate



# CAO – GENERAL INFO.

- \* There are 3 types of courses students can apply for under the <u>Nat. Qualifications Framework</u>.
- x These are applied for on 2 separate lists on a single form:

Level 6 & 7 Courses	Level 8 Courses
Ordinary Degrees (7) Higher Certificates (6)	Honours Degrees (8)
Up to 10 Course Choices	Up to 10 Course Choices

- The courses are clearly labelled in the CAO Handbook
- N.B. Care must be taken with courses marked '*Restricted'*.
- These courses cannot be applied for after February 1<sup>st</sup> due to extra assessments required.

# POINTS SYSTEM

Generally in the CAO system

- No. of qualified applicants > No. of course places --> selection system is needed.
- Selection system used in Irish 3<sup>rd</sup> Level Colleges is <u>POINTS SYSTEM</u>
- **×**Points are calculated from **ONE** sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- **×**Points total is calculated from **SIX** best subjects
- **\***Bonus points are awarded for Honours Mathematics by

+ All colleges.

Entry Requirements (Not Points) can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate (except for Medicine)

# WHAT ABE THE MAIN CHANGES?

- The number of grade bands were reduced from 14 to 8
- \* The Common Points Scale has been altered to reflect the reduction in grade bands.
- \* Points will be awarded for a H7 grade to reflect the level of achievement represented by a H7 and to encourage the take-up of higher level subjects.
- The mechanics of the CAO application and offer process will remain the same.
- **\*** Bonus points for Higher Level Maths will still be awarded.

# ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

From 2018, a Higher Level H7 grade will contribute to the new basic matriculation requirements which the Universities and IT's have introduced to take account of the new grading scheme.

## NUI COLLEGES LEVEL 8 COURSES

- UCD, UCC, NUI Galway, NUI Maynooth, RCSI, College of Art and Design:
- Minimum entry 6 subjects, including Maths, English, Irish and (possibly) a third language.
- × 2 H5's and 4 H7/06's.
- Many courses also require a third language or additional course requirements, such as maths, or a science subject for specific courses.

## NON NUI COLLEGES LEVEL 8 COURSES

- University of Limerick (UL), Trinity College Dublin and DCU.
- × Minimum entry 6 subjects.
- Subjects must including English, Maths\* and a language other than English.
- × 2 H5's and 4 H7/06's.
- Many courses also require additional course requirements, such as maths, or a science subject for specific courses.
- \*Foundation level maths is accepted for some courses.

### COLLEGES OF EDUCATION LEVEL 8

- DCU, Mary Immaculate, Froebel College at Maynooth University and Coláiste Mhuire Marino)
- × 3 H5's, including Irish, 3 06/H7's.
- Maths and English should be part of the 6 subjects

## INSTITUTES OF TECHNOLOGY (IOT'S)

- Level 8 (Honours Degree) courses: 2 H5's and 4 06/H7's.
- Maths and either Irish or English are required
- Levels 6 and 7 (Higher Certificate and Ordinary Degree): 5 06/H7's.
- Maths and Irish or English are required

- Applications must be made online
- × Always keep proof of sending application: online print screen receipt.
- **×** Form is very straight forward to fill out.


#### **\*\*VERY IMPORTANT\*\***

**x** Students must fill out both course lists in:

#### **Genuine Order of Preference**

- They should not put down courses on the basis of their predictions of next years cut off points or their own points scores.
- × Why? Look at how places are allocated.






#### If all Entry Requirements are met $\rightarrow$ applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.






#### 320 was the lowest points to gain entry




## Genuine Order of Preference





- Simply list your courses in genuine order of preference from the highest preference 1, to the lowest preference 10.
- If you are entitled to an offer, you will be offered the highest preference that you are entitled to.

# PLACES ALLOCATION

- The position of a course in a student's preference order does not in any way affect their chance of getting a place on that course.
- The exact same procedure takes place for both lists on the form, hence students may get get 2 offers in August – one from each list, may accept only one.
- Students should think carefully if not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.
- Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in round
   1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in
   subsequent rounds if they become entitled one.

# AFTER MAKING APPLICATION

- Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices check this carefully.
- **x** Some students may be called for extra assessments.
- **\*** Receive Statement of Application Record check details carefully.
- Change of Mind facility becomes available use sparingly and carefully.
- **×** Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO.
- **×** Places are allocated and offered by post and online.
- **x** Students accept, reject or defer offered places.
- **×** Further rounds of offers are made until all course places are filled.

# Deferral

- This is arranged AFTER an offer is made.
   (Read the CAO Handbook P.20 about this.)
- You are recommended to check with the college in advance about their deferral conditions and arrangements.
- The CAO Handbook mentions some courses where deferral will be difficult or impossible.



- Complete your application online
- Pay the fee by credit/debit card



- Acknowledgement (by March)
- Statement of Application Record (by end of May)
- Change of Mind Facility until July 1st
- Possible Offers (end August)
