# IT IS THE APPLICANTS RESPONSIBILITY TO:

05/11/2019

- × **RESEARCH** thoroughly all the courses for which he/she is making application. This means find out about the course content/modules for each year of the course. Is work experience part of the course?
- × **Do not look at 1<sup>st</sup> Yr. only, look at content for all years of the course.**
- × Some colleges give a detailed outline of each module eg NUIM (course finder), NUIG (course outline)

- × Go to Open Days
- × Be au fait with all aspects of the application system used (CAO) for these courses, i.e., procedures, dates, fees, rules, etc.

# CAO PROCESS

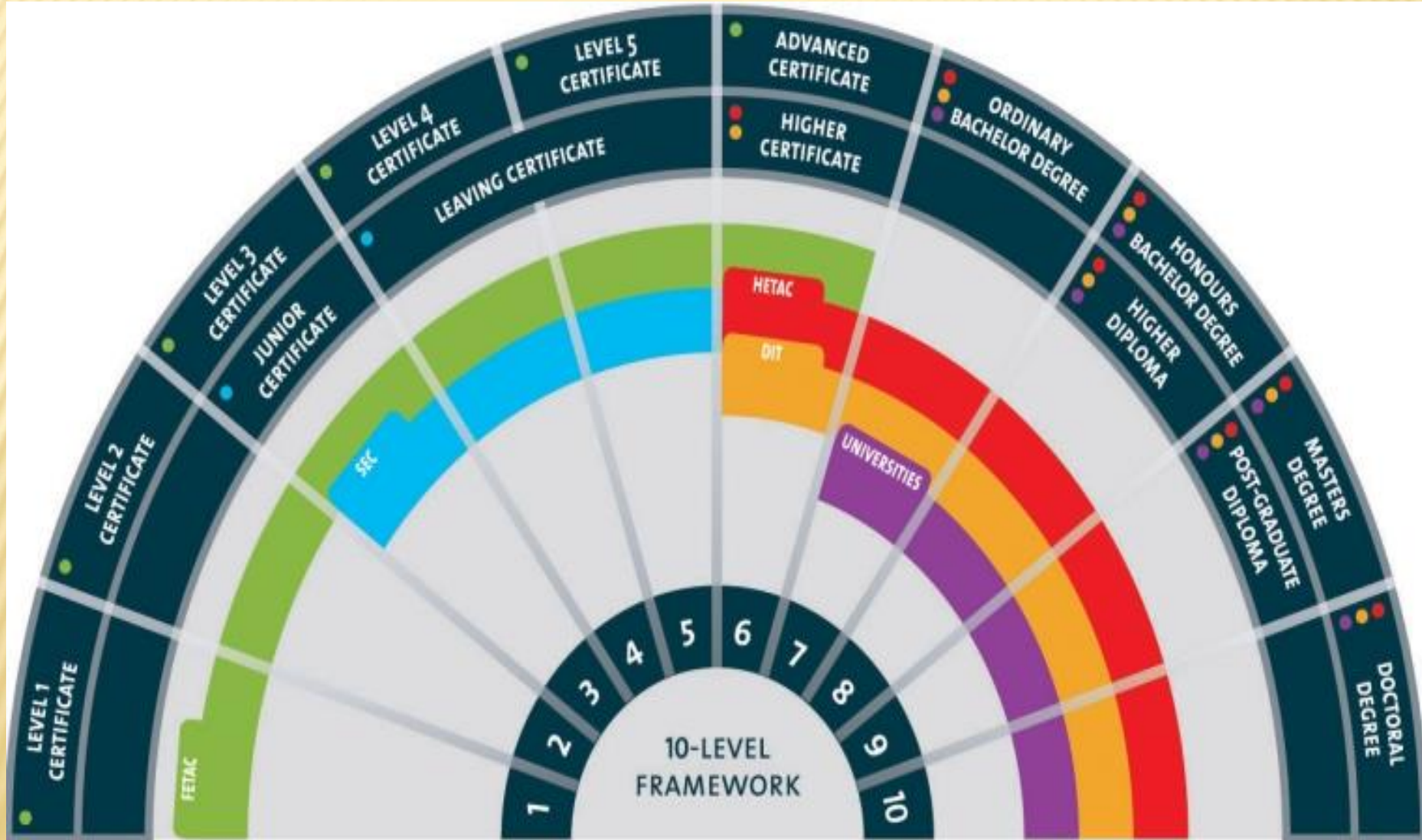
- ✘ Centralised application system for all Irish 3<sup>rd</sup> level institutions, including fee-paying colleges.
- ✘ Every 6<sup>th</sup> year should now have a CAO Application Pack which includes: 2020 CAO Handbook – application and course information
- ✘ Application Dates and Fees
- ✘ CAO on line application **\*NOW OPEN\***

**All fees are non-refundable.**

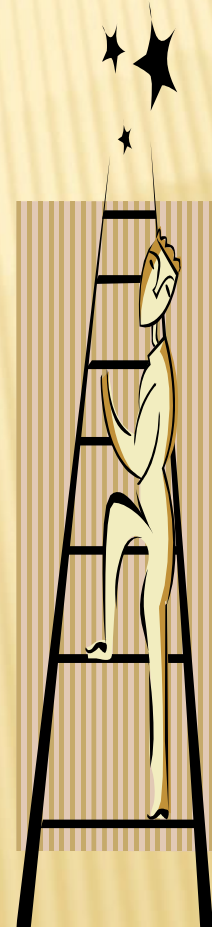


# National Framework of Qualifications

- Level 8 Honours Degree
- Level 7 Ordinary Degree
- Level 6 Higher Certificate
- Level 4/5 Leaving Certificate/PLC
- Level 3 Junior Certificate



# CAO – GENERAL INFO.

- ✘ There are 3 types of courses students can apply for under the Nat. Qualifications Framework.
- ✘ These are applied for on 2 separate lists on a single form:

## Level 6 & 7 Courses

Ordinary Degrees (7)  
Higher Certificates (6)

Up to 10 Course Choices

## Level 8 Courses

Honours Degrees (8)

Up to 10 Course Choices

- The courses are clearly labelled in the CAO Handbook
- N.B. – Care must be taken with courses marked '*Restricted*'.
- These courses cannot be applied for after February 1<sup>st</sup> due to extra assessments required.

# POINTS SYSTEM

Generally in the CAO system

No. of qualified applicants  $\gt$  No. of course places

--> selection system is needed.

Selection system used in Irish 3<sup>rd</sup> Level Colleges is

## POINTS SYSTEM

- ✘ Points are calculated from **ONE** sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- ✘ Points total is calculated from **SIX** best subjects
- ✘ Bonus points are awarded for Honours Mathematics by
  - + All colleges.
- ✘ Entry Requirements (Not Points) can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate (except for Medicine)

# WHAT ARE THE MAIN CHANGES?

- ✘ The number of grade bands were reduced from 14 to 8
- ✘ The Common Points Scale has been altered to reflect the reduction in grade bands.
- ✘ Points will be awarded for a H7 grade to reflect the level of achievement represented by a H7 and to encourage the take-up of higher level subjects.
- ✘ The mechanics of the CAO application and offer process will remain the same.
- ✘ Bonus points for Higher Level Maths will still be awarded.

# ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

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- ✘ From 2018, a Higher Level H7 grade will contribute to the new basic matriculation requirements which the Universities and IT's have introduced to take account of the new grading scheme.

## NUI COLLEGES LEVEL 8 COURSES

- ✘ UCD, UCC, NUI Galway, NUI Maynooth, RCSI, College of Art and Design:
- ✘ Minimum entry - 6 subjects, including Maths, English, Irish and (possibly) a third language.
- ✘ **2 H5's and 4 H7/O6's.**
- ✘ Many courses also require a third language or additional course requirements, such as maths, or a science subject for specific courses.

## NON NUI COLLEGES LEVEL 8 COURSES

- ✘ University of Limerick (UL), Trinity College Dublin and DCU.
- ✘ Minimum entry – 6 subjects.
- ✘ Subjects must including English, Maths\* and a language other than English.
- ✘ **2 H5's and 4 H7/O6's.**
- ✘ Many courses also require additional course requirements, such as maths, or a science subject for specific courses.
- ✘ \*Foundation level maths is accepted for some courses.



## COLLEGES OF EDUCATION LEVEL 8

- × DCU, Mary Immaculate, Froebel College at Maynooth University and Coláiste Mhuire Marino)
- × 3 H5's, including Irish, 3 O6/H7's.
- × Maths and English should be part of the 6 subjects

## INSTITUTES OF TECHNOLOGY (IOT'S)

- × Level 8 (Honours Degree) courses: 2 H5's and 4 O6/H7's.
- × Maths and either Irish or English are required
- × Levels 6 and 7 (Higher Certificate and Ordinary Degree): 5 O6/H7's.
- × Maths and Irish or English are required

# MAKING AN APPLICATION

- × Applications must be made online
- × Always keep proof of sending application: online – print screen receipt.
- × Form is very straight forward to fill out.
- × [www.cao.ie](http://www.cao.ie)

**\*\*VERY IMPORTANT\*\***

- × Students must fill out both course lists in:

**Genuine Order of Preference**

- × They should not put down courses on the basis of their predictions of next years cut off points or their own points scores.
- × Why? – Look at how places are allocated.

Minimum of 5O6/H7 grades
  - ✘ (Level 8)  
2 H5 + 4O6/H7 grades
- Pass in:**
- ✓ Irish
  - ✓ English
  - ✓ Mathematics
  - ✓ Foreign Language

## Specific Faculty Requirements

- ✘ H4 Maths  
Engineering(NUI Galway)
- H5 Chemistry  
Veterinary Medicine(UCD)
- H3 French  
Law and French (TCD)

**If all Entry Requirements are met → applicant is deemed  
'Qualified' to apply.**

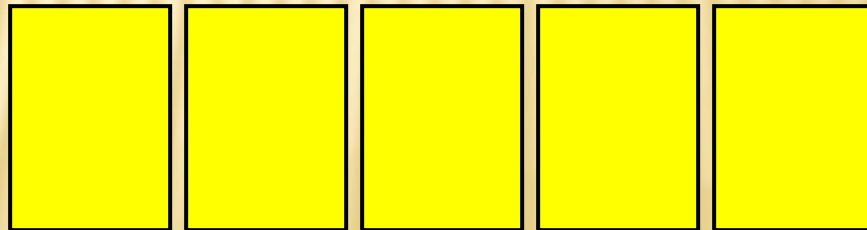

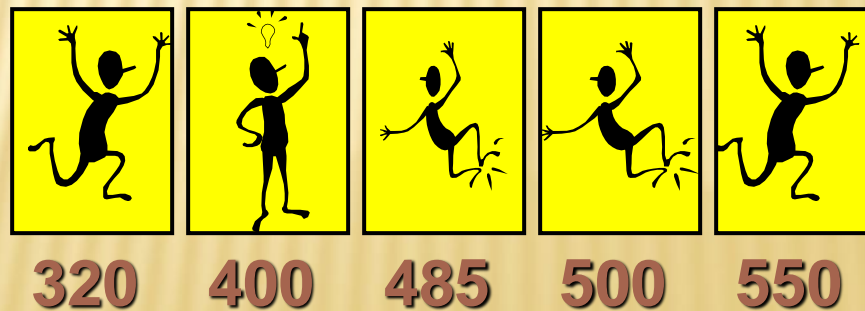

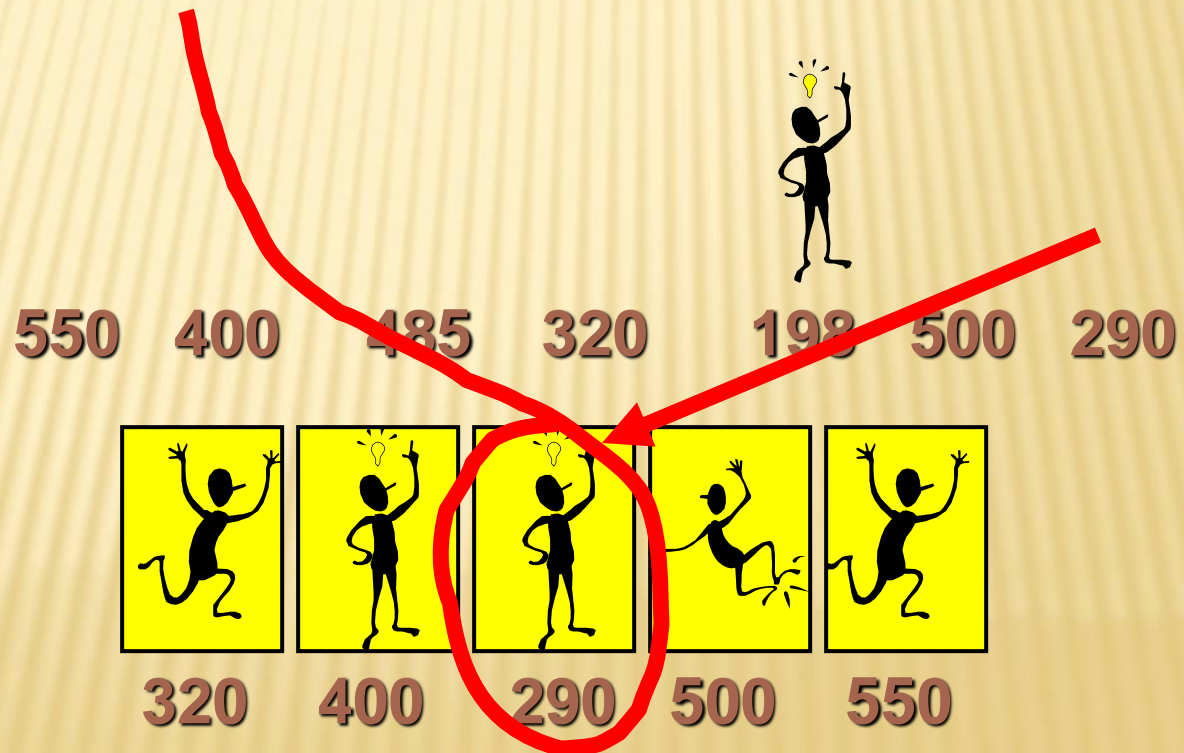




**320 was the lowest points to gain entry**

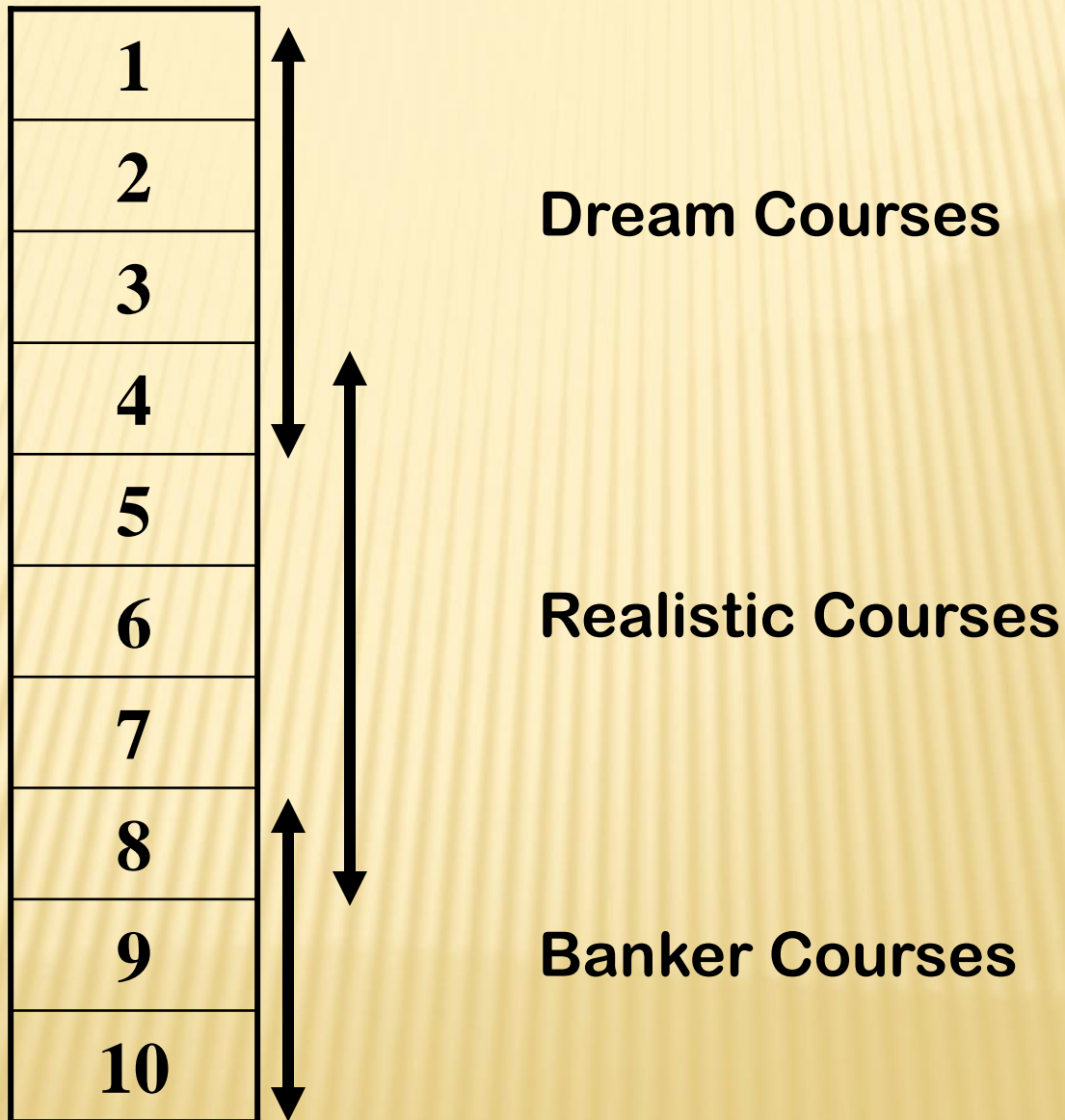

# Genuine Order of Preference



- You do not need to guess what the points are going to be for the courses you are interested in.
- Simply list your courses in genuine order of preference from the highest preference 1, to the lowest preference 10.
- If you are entitled to an offer, you will be offered the highest preference that you are entitled to.

# So what is the best way to fill in the courses?



# PLACES ALLOCATION

- ✘ **The position of a course in a student's preference order does not in any way affect their chance of getting a place on that course.**
- ✘ **The exact same procedure takes place for both lists on the form, hence students may get 2 offers in August – one from each list, may accept only one.**
- ✘ **Students should think carefully if not accepting one of these offers, as they may not receive any further offers.**
- ✘ **Regardless of whether or not they accept a course in round 1, they will still be offered a higher preference course in subsequent rounds if they become entitled one.**

# AFTER MAKING APPLICATION

- ✘ **Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices – check this carefully.**
- ✘ **Some students may be called for extra assessments.**
- ✘ **Receive Statement of Application Record – check details carefully.**
- ✘ **Change of Mind facility becomes available – use sparingly and carefully.**
- ✘ **Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO.**
- ✘ **Places are allocated and offered by post and online.**
- ✘ **Students accept, reject or defer offered places.**
- ✘ **Further rounds of offers are made until all course places are filled.**

# Deferral

- **This is arranged AFTER an offer is made.  
(Read the CAO Handbook P.20 about this.)**
- **You are recommended to check with the college in advance about their deferral conditions and arrangements.**
- **The CAO Handbook mentions some courses where deferral will be difficult or impossible.**

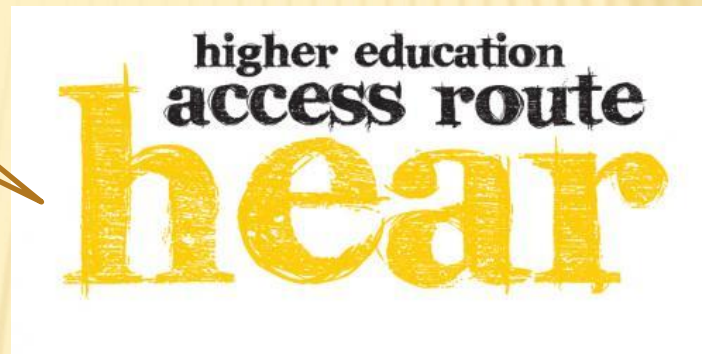
