












ONE SUBJECT'S JOURNEY

FIRST YEAR ART: Visual Art

Why choose Art, Craft and Design?

- It helps you to learn how to explore and investigate ideas for making your own work.
- Your unique Creativity is guided in order to create imaginative pieces of Art/Craft/Design.
- Developing your drawing, painting making skills perhaps for the first time, where you are learning to properly observe shapes, tones and colour.
- Learning NEW craftwork skills in Printmaking, Pottery, Fabric work.
- Learning how to Design work in Graphic Design Poster work.
- Developing how to properly Display and Present your work to look effective and have a good quality finish.

<u>COURSE WORK OVER 3 YEARS:</u>

Year One:

Practical and Theory are interlinked with learning new skills.

Practical 80% and Theory/Research 20% combined.

Year Two:

Practical Exam (CBA 1) After Christmas.

Practical 80% and Theory/Research 20% combined.

Year Three:

Practical exam (CBA2) September/October

(Research and Development of ideas for work. (Practical 50% and Theory 50%)

<u>CBA 3</u>: State Exam in January.

Our Economy enables students to understand the dynamic relationship between the local, national and international economic situation.

- Final Exam (90%)


Wood Technology

- This subject will involves the use of a range of materials, particularly wood, in designing and creating a range of projects
- You will use a range of hand tools and machines in project work and will understand the use of these tools and machines
- You will be able to use your own creativity in the design of projects
- Theory work will include Forest Management, Growth of trees, Disease in Wood, Jointing Methods, Hand and Power Tools, Woodturning and Woodfinishing
- In First year 50% Practical and 50% Theory
- For Junior Cert 70% of marks will be for the chosen project you make and 30% for your written exam



Graphics

- This subject will involve the use of freehand sketching, computer based drawing and board drawing in the communication of information in graphical format
- It will involve the visualisation of both 2D and 3D objects
- You will use your creativity in the effective design, scaling and appearance of your drawings
- For the Junior Cert 70% of marks is for the drawing exam and 30% for your project



<mark>Metalwork</mark>

- This subject involves working with metals and plastics to make projects and understand the processes involved
- You will be using both hand tools and machines
- Designing is an important aspect of this subject
- For Junior Cert 75% for practical work
- Ask previous students for advice

DO I NEED TO CHOOSE A FOREIGN Language?

- At Present: NUI Colleges (NUI Galway, Maynooth University, UCC & UCD) require a 3rd Language for entry to most courses.
- Other colleges require two languages: English and Irish/3rd Language.
- Institutes of Technology require English or Irish.
- The Defence Force Cadetship also requires Irish, English and a 3rd Language.
- Garda Siochana Requires two languages: English and Irish/3rd Language
- You do not need a 3rd language to study Science, Nursing, Engineering or Primary School Teaching.
