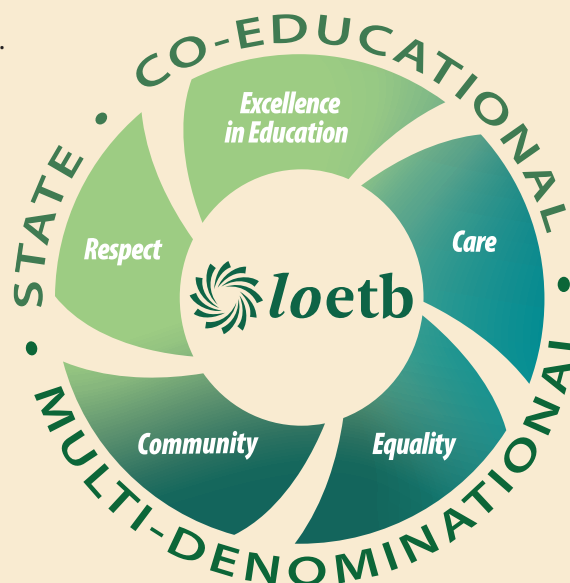

SCHOOL BOOKS

Junior Cycle books, ebooks and core classroom resources are covered by the new Government Junior Cycle Schoolbooks Scheme. At Banagher College we operate a book rental scheme for Senior Cycle. The scheme aims to lessen the financial burden on Parents/Guardians. Parents are asked to pay an annual fee for the loan of these books. Book stocks are regularly updated to ensure that students have access to recently published books.

SCHOOL LOCKERS

All students are provided with lockers to allow them to store their books and equipment. Students have access to lockers before class begins in the morning, at break and lunch times. This reduces the weight of heavy school bags for students.

ICT

All students will have their own digital device to assist their learning and development in the school. Each student is issued with a unique school email address and access to secure cloud storage for school and project work.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS

- Specified blue round neck jumper with grey stripe in the collar and school crest.
- Royal blue/navy/grey pleated skirt (Style no. 14774) or a tailored navy trousers (**leggings not allowed**).
- White shirt or polo shirt with school crest.
- Navy knee length socks or navy tights.

BOYS' UNIFORM

- Specified blue round neck jumper with grey stripe in the collar and school crest.
- Slate grey trousers. (**Denim, Cord or Casual trousers are not allowed**)
- White shirt or polo shirt with school crest.

FOOTWEAR

- Sensible black, navy or brown shoes allowed.
- Deck Shoes allowed (white soles permitted on Deck Shoes).
- Runners style shoes **MUST BE ALL BLACK – NO COLOURED SOLES, MARKINGS, STRIPES OR LOGOS ALLOWED.**
- Black or white laces only.
- Canvas shoes not allowed.

PE UNIFORM

- Plain black or navy joggers – **No leggings allowed.**
- School polo shirt.
- Plain black runners.

CANTEEN FACILITIES

Banagher College Canteen facilities are available on-site. Students can avail of a wide variety of hot and cold lunches, provided at a reasonable cost by Get Fresh Catering.



All payments to the school can be made online through the Way2Pay platform. When a payment is due a text message will be sent to the parent/guardian's phone requesting payment.

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Leaving Cert Applied (LCA)

The Leaving Certificate Applied is a two-year Leaving Certificate, available to students who wish to follow a practical or vocationally orientated programme. The Leaving Certificate Applied is made up of a range of courses that are structured round three elements: Vocational Preparation, Vocational Education and General Education.

The programme sets out to recognise the talents of all students and to provide opportunities for developing personal

responsibility, self-esteem and self-knowledge, and helps students apply what they learn to the real world. Students spend one day each week on work experience. Students must maintain 90% attendance during the two years.

Students who successfully complete the programme are awarded a Leaving Certificate from the Department of Education and Science. The certificate is awarded at three levels: Pass; Merit; and Distinction.

Transition Year (TY)

Transition Year is a stand alone year between 3rd Year and 5th Year, where students undertake a wide selection of subjects in a modular format. This helps students choose the correct set of subjects for their Leaving Certificate. Added to this academic exposure is the opportunity to build their interpersonal skills, social awareness skills and personal confidence. DISCIPLINE

Our Code of Conduct is drawn up with a view to ensuring good order and good discipline which in turn facilitate effective teaching and learning. Our system is based on Christian values. The emphasis is on the development of self discipline and respect for others.

CAREER GUIDANCE/COUNSELLING

The school has a Guidance Counsellor who together with other staff members provide comprehensive career guidance and education support programmes to students.

LEARNING SUPPORT

The school has fully qualified Special Education and LearningSupport teachers who have a very effective Educational Support Programme in operation. Specialist intervention can prove very valuable for students who have lost out or have fallen behind in a particular subject.

CHAPLAIN

The school has a fully qualified Chaplain who works in conjunction with the Guidance Counsellor and Student Support Team and is always available to liaise with students, parents/guardians.

PASTORAL CARE

Pastoral Care is the responsibility of all teachers particularly the Year Heads who co-ordinate the work of the Class Tutor. Each class has it's own Class Tutor who takes a special interest in the general wellbeing and academic progress of each student in his/her class.

FINDING OUR STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES

The school's SSE Team use the information gathered to decide what areas we are going to focus on improving in Banagher College. This then becomes the most important part of the school S.I.P. (School Improvement Plan).

The school then puts the ideas for improvements from the plan into action. This can mean new or better ideas for improving school life in general or to help with teaching and learning in the classroom.

WHAT DOES THE PLAN FOCUS ON IN BANAGHER COLLEGE?

In Banagher College, the areas we've been working to improve further in the school year 23/24 were **Digital Technology** and **Inclusion**, while in the school year, 24/25, we are also going to be focused on our **Wellbeing** and our **Ethos**.



S.T.E.A.M. ROOM

The school has recently added a S.T.E.A.M. (Science Technology Engineering Arts and Maths) room to provide a hub for digital learning and creativity in the school. Among other things, the room is used for various coding workshops facilitated by the school's S.T.E.A.M. Team.

The room is equipped with state of the art digital equipment, including a full suite of Microbits and accessories, Vex Robotics kits, Sphero programmable robots, a 3D Printer and much more. The S.T.E.A.M. room also houses a video production studio, with green screen and 360 degree cameras, as well as Oculus Quest Virtual Reality.

The latest addition to the room is a fully equipped Podcast studio, called the 'Bog Pod Studio' where student teams use state-of-the-art equipment to record and share podcast content covering a range of subjects and themes. The studio has quickly become one of the most popular parts of the S.T.E.A.M. room.

The S.T.E.A.M. room is also used as a home for the School Digital Champion teams and School Robotics team, as well as being the base classroom for the TY Digital Technology curriculum. The purpose of the continuing development of the room is to provide further opportunities for students to develop a range of 21st Century digital skills. Recently the room has become home to the school's popular S.T.E.A.M. Club, where students can engage with various S.T.E.A.M. projects at lunch-time.

Students in Banagher College also have the opportunity to participate in the LOETB S.T.E.A.M. Programme, where the school is provided with equipment and training across the four strands of the programme: Vex Robotics, First LEGO league robotics, Minecraft Education design and podcasting. Each strand also has its own competition, between all nine LOETB schools. In the most recent competition, Banagher College won the Vex robotics strand, claiming the top prize at this year's LOETB S.T.E.A.M. Programme showcase event, in the process taking away almost €2000 prizes for themselves and the school.

Banagher College was also one of only a small number of midland schools whose comprehensive proposal for Department of Education S.T.E.M. funding was successful, with the school receiving a €10,000 grant to further enhance digital learning and S.T.E.A.M. opportunities in the school.

EUROPEAN DIGITAL SCHOOL AWARDS

In 2023, Banagher College achieved a European Digital Schools Award as recognition for its achievements in using digital technologies to enhance both teaching and learning, as well as the overall student experience in the school.

After a rigorous judgement process, Banagher College was awarded all six categories in the competition for the work that has taken place as part of the School's Digital Strategy. Not only did the school get awarded all categories, but the school – thanks to its dedicated Digital Learning Team – is now also recognised as a mentor school, offering site visits and supports to other schools seeking to replicate the success of Banagher College in the area of digital technology use.

TECHNOLOGY AT BANAGHER COLLEGE

Technology is now at the centre of the learner experience at Banagher College. The school prides itself on its ability to use the growing array of educational tech tools available to enhance the quality of the learner experience. The Microsoft 365 suite of software, with Microsoft Teams and Onenote at its centre, has become a crucial tool to assist teaching and learning for students in the school.

This digital transition, where the power of technology is harnessed to make the student experience even more engaging and rewarding, has led to digital technology being embedded across all our subject departments.

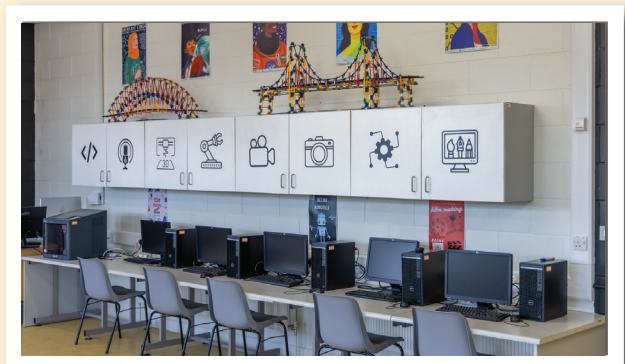
As well as our new S.T.E.A.M. room, which functions as the centre of digital learning in the school, each classroom is also fitted with state-of-the-art wireless technology – allowing seamless technology-driven interaction between students and teachers. The school also houses three fully functioning computer labs and a DCG suite, which are complemented by class sets of laptops and ipads.

This year's First Year cohort are the fourth group to be part of the next stage in the digital development of Banagher College. They have begun their school journey with their own digital learning devices, which they use to assist their learning and development in the school. The many benefits of students having their own educational specific learning devices are clear: everything from the advantages of using e-books; to giving students more autonomy over their own learning; to building their digital skills to prepare them for the digital workplace and society of the future. This group joins our second years as they lead the way to Banagher College becoming a fully 1:1 school (one device per student) as part of the school's Digital Learning Strategy.

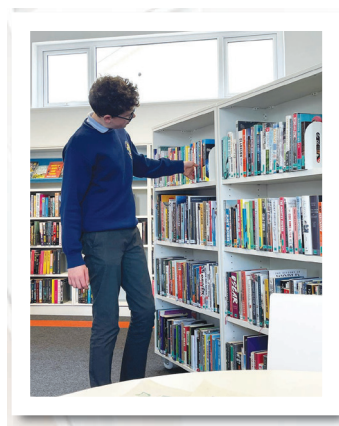
